SOPHOMORE MAKING A DIFFERENCE THIS SUMMER

Tianmai Bishop is entering her Sophomore year at Wilson this fall. This summer she was accepted into the "Teens-n-Trails" program with the Northwest Youth Corps out of Eugene this summer for an entire month. It is a great opportunity for young people 14-15 years old to challenge themselves in an outdoor environment building/restoring biking/hiking trails, enhancing wildlife habitat, laying out fences and much more, while camping out for four weeks! The teens worked hard, played hard, and even studied hard at times, and perhaps most of all felt a feeling of great satisfaction at the end of each day. They worked on average of six hours each day during the week on projects that varied from week to week in different locations. Weekends were dedicated to fun and exploration. Tianmai lived with her crew of about 10 teens 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and the best part was that they all loved their experience even though there were no electronic devices allowed the entire month!! They learned a great deal about teamwork, cooperation, leadership, and problem solving. On graduation day, many of the team members related their experiences of pride in what they were doing, making some great friends, and developing muscles they didn't know they had. There is no camp cook so they all chipped in to prepare meals and wash dishes. Tianmai had a great time and looks forward to making it next year. PROPOSALS FOR WOMEN FILMMAKERS

Chicken & Egg Pictures (CE) has announced the launch of its Mother Wit Human Rights Film Fund to advance the human rights movement through the support of story-driven documentaries. Films should encourage action domestically and globally in any number of areas, including civil rights; reproductive health rights; environmental, racial, and economic justice; education and literacy; and issues related to women and girls. Films must lead with a story and help expand and extend the definition of human rights to mean all the basic rights needed for people to thrive. The fund will provide support for nonfiction features, nonfiction shorts, hybrid, new media/multiple platforms, and other categories of film. For a project to be eligible, the film's director must be a woman. CE will also fund films with female/male co-directors. Filmmakers must be affiliated with a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization or have an eligible fiscal sponsor. CE grants range from \$5,000 to \$25,000 for non-executive produced projects.
