Dear Wilson Community,

I just met with two representative of the German-American Society to receive a donation for \$20,000.00 to support the continuation of German 1-2 this year. This is the beginning of an intentional outreach to Wilson High from the society. Their donation allowed us to add back German 1-2, an elimination which was a direct result of the staffing reductions we had to make this year due to district and state budget shortfalls for education.

We also had an anonymous donation last week of \$10,000 dollars that will allow support to the English department in addition to what we'll be adding back with the German-American Society. It's complicated, but has to do with two teachers who teach German, English and ESL. We are still assessing additional English supports that are needed.

Finally, thank you to all of you who have made donations to the Wilson Foundation last Spring during our calling campaign and this fall during registration. We will also be adding additional sections in the Science and Mathematics departments.

I feel so grateful to all who have recognized the need we have at Wilson and have through your generosity supported a stronger learning environment.

PSAT/NMSQT TEST @ WILSON ON OCTOBER 12

All sophomores will take the **PSAT/NMSQT** test on **Wednesday**, **October 12** at Wilson High. Oregon Dept. of Education provides this test, **at no charge**, **to all sophomores**. Each high school will administer it to their own students on this day. No pre-registration is needed for sophomores – this will happen in class.

Juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the test as well for a chance to compete for the National Merit Scholarship. The cost is **\$20 for juniors** to take the test and you can sign up with our bookkeeper now through **September 28**. If financial assistance is needed, please see Abby Menashe in the main office.

All grades will have school that day starting at **8:15am**. There will be changes to the bell schedule that day which will be explained in advance.

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) is a national standardized assessment that measures various skills your students will need for higher education and careers after high school. It provides firsthand practice for the SAT® and gain access to college and career planning tools. It also gives juniors a chance to enter NMSC scholarship programs.

PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARDS FOR YOUNG VOLUNTEERS

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards program annually honors middle and high school students across the U.S. for helping to improve their communities through volunteer activities. The program's goals are to applaud young people who already are making a positive difference in their towns and neighborhoods, and to inspire others to think about how they might contribute to their communities. The awards, sponsored by Prudential Financial, Inc. in partnership with the National Association of Secondary School Principals, honor outstanding community service performed during the previous year by young people in grades 5 through 12 at the local, state, and national levels. To be eligible, a young person must be in grades 5-12 as of November 1, 2011; be a legal resident of any U.S. state or Washington, D.C.; have engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least partly during the twelve months prior to the date of application; and submit a completed application to a school principal or the head of an officially designated local organization by the November 1 deadline. Participating schools and local organizations will select local honorees in November and present them with Certificates of Achievement. All local honorees are then reviewed by a state-level judging committee, which will name the top two candidates from each state and the District of Columbia — one high school student and one middle level student -— as state honorees in February 2012. State honorees will each receive \$1,000 awards, engraved silver medallions, and an allexpense-paid trip (with parent) to Washington, D.C., in May 2012 for recognition events. Runners-up at the state level will receive bronze medallions or Certificates of Excellence. In Washington, a national selection committee will name ten of the one hundred and two state honorees as America's top youth volunteers of the year. These national honorees will each receive additional awards of \$5,000, gold medallions, crystal trophies for their nominating schools or organizations, and \$5,000 grants from the Prudential Foundation for the nonprofit, charitable organizations of their choice. **Deadline: November 1, 2011**. STATE FARM GOOD NEIGHBOR SERVICE-LEARNING GRANTS

State Farm and Youth Service America are offering grants of up to \$1,000 for the promotion of service-learning projects in K-12 public schools in all fifty U.S. states and the District of Columbia, and in the Canadian provinces of Alberta, Ontario, and New Brunswick. Each grant will engage participating youth in service-learning, a teaching and learning strategy that helps to promote student learning, academic achievement, workplace readiness, and stronger communities. The State Farm Good Neighbor Service-Learning Grants encourage semester-long projects — a "Semester of Service" — that launch on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service (January 16, 2012) and culminate on Global Youth Service Day (April 20-22, 2012). Applicants must be a teacher, service-learning coordinator, or student (age 5 to 25) in a K-12 public school; or a staff member or youth in a community-based organization working within a K-12 public school. Projects must serve a real community need and have intentional learning goals (content or academic standards that students will meet by developing and implementing the service-learning project). Students should participate in a meaningful way at every stage of the project. Up to one hundred and twenty-five grants will be awarded; at least ten to fifteen grants will support projects addressing teen driver safety issues. JEWISH COMMUNITY HEROES AWARDS HONOR VOLUNTEER SERVICE

The Jewish Federations of North America has announced the launch of the Third Annual Jewish Community Hero Awards, aimed at connecting people through social media to recognize the selflessness and courage of those who are helping their communities through volunteer service. Nominations of individuals from all walks of life are invited. Examples include a neighbor running nonprofit bake sales, a volunteer who serves the elderly at a local retirement home, a teacher building a school for the underserved, or a community organizer bringing people together. Nominations may be of professionals who earn a living from their socially conscious work, or of volunteers who do not earn any income from the services they offer to their community. Any U.S. or Canadian resident of at least 13 years of age is eligible to be nominated through September 27, 2011. Anyone can nominate a hero and vote for candidates. This year, voting will take place between September 7 and November 10, 2011, and ten semi-finalists will be announced from each of the two award categories - professionals and individuals - on November 15, 2011 A panel of judges will select the Jewish Community Hero of the Year, as well as four finalists, from among the twenty nominees who receive the most online support. The Jewish Federations will recognize the 2011 honorees and announce the Jewish Community Hero of the Year at a special event in December 2011. The winning hero will receive a grant of \$25,000 to support their community project. **Deadline:** September 27, 2011 (Nominations). Link to Complete RFP:
