WILSON TEACHER HONORED WITH LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Principal Sue Brent is pleased to announce that **Diana Fisher** was given a **Lifetime Achievement Award** from the System Dynamics and Systems Dynamics Society at their international conference in Washington, D.C. in July 2011. "Wilson is so proud of Diana Fisher's achievements and is grateful for her work with our students," adds Sue. Diana said that it was an exciting experience to receive the award. During her presentation at the conference she spoke about how system dynamics modeling could be introduced in K-12 education, starting with systems thinking concepts in elementary school and progressing to building models in 9th grade (but some students start building simple models in 5th or 6th grade in other schools in the US). "The work of some of the Wilson students who were in my modeling class (Harrison Cassady and Joseph Kibe) was highlighted in my presentation," adds Diana. Three of her modeling students from Wilson attended the International System Dynamics Conference in Albuquerque, NM in 2009 (Marcus Robinson, James Ranney, and Joseph Kibe) and presented their models in one of the parallel sessions (to a packed house). Current Wilson senior Henry Li also presented his work in a poster session at that conference when he was just a freshman. Also, at that conference, a research scientist from Sandia National Laboratories requested Travis Mandell's model and technical paper on 'Airport Security' because he was part of a group that was going to try to model the same topic. Megan Hoarfrost received an internship with a professor at PSU because she knew system dynamics modeling.

Diana says that the work the students can produce is truly amazing. "It is my hope to train interested high school teachers (math, environmental science, biology, health, economics, global studies, and physics) in the coming years to use and/or build models to use in their classes. The study of feedback interactions in systems is the focus of the modeling effort (spread of epidemics, jobs/labor, natural resource depletion, how drugs work in the body, supply/demand/price interactions, etc.), and understanding how systems operate is so important in today's world." DENTAL EXPLORING PROGRAM

OHSU's Dental Exploring Program is in its twenty-second year of providing participants with a general perception of what a career in dentistry is all about. Participating high school students have been very enthusiastic about their experience, and many of them have successfully matriculated to dental school. Monthly two-hour meetings are held at the dental school with an emphasis on "hands-on" activities. The first hour is composed of a lecture from dental school faculty from a variety of disciplines, while the second hour is a laboratory experience. Dental students organize the monthly meetings and act as mentors. Space is limited to sixty participants and is reserved on a first come, first serve basis. A complete application, both consent forms and the \$30 fee must be on file to reserve a space. A waiting list will be maintained for students with complete applications received after the first sixty spaces have been reserved. Students will be notified as space becomes available. PSAT/NMSQT TEST @ WILSON ON OCTOBER 12

All sophomores will take the **PSAT/NMSQT** test on **Wednesday**, **October 12** at Wilson High **at no charge**, **to all sophomores**. Each high school will administer the test on this day. No preregistration is needed for sophomores – this will happen in class. Juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the test as well for a chance to compete for the National Merit Scholarship. Cost is **\$20 for juniors** to take the test, sign up with our bookkeeper now through **September 28**. If financial assistance is needed, see Abby Menashe in main office. All grades will have school that day starting at **8:15am**, with changes to the bell schedule that day that will be explained in advance. Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) is a national standardized assessment that measures various skills your students will need for higher education and careers after high school. NATIONAL CIVICS CONTEST FOR STUDENTS

Retired U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor and the <u>Verizon Foundation</u> have announced the launch of a new national contest for middle schools designed to help renew the teaching of civic engagement. The contest, Civic Impact Challenge, involves using <u>iCivics</u> to teach students civics, encourage them to learn about their rights and responsibilities as citizens, and learn and understand the workings of the U.S. government. The Civic Impact Challenge contest is open to classrooms (grades 5-12) across the country. Classes participating in the contest can earn "impact points" by playing any of fourteen civics games that are part of the iCivics curriculum. Games cover such topics as civil rights, how a bill becomes a law, and the role of local government. The class that earns the most impact points between October 3 and November 30, 2011, will win a VGo telepresence robot and receive a virtual visit from O'Connor. After the contest, students can donate their earned impact points to benefit a variety of community projects run by other youth, connecting their classroom civic education to real-world civic participation.
