WILSON GRAD, TEACHER, COACH NAMED TO UNIVERSITY OF OREGON HALL OF FAME

According to the University of Oregon, **Michele Potestio**, a women's soccer All-American, will be inducted into the University of Oregon's 20th Athletics Hall of Fame class during the weekend of the Ducks' October 29 home football game vs. Washington State in Autzen Stadium. Michele graduated from Wilson in 1979 and played Varsity soccer for three years (1976-1977-1978). Michele and the Wilson team were PIL City champions in 1976 and 1977, and were AAA Oregon State Champions in 1977. Michele was a three-time MVP on the Varsity soccer team and was three-time All-PIL and All-State. At the University of Oregon, she was a two-time All-American during women's soccer's first tenure as a varsity sport, where she led Oregon to a national tournament appearance in 1981. Monthly two-hour meetings are held at the dental school with an emphasis on "hands-on" activities. The first hour is composed of a lecture from dental school faculty from a variety of disciplines, while the second hour is a laboratory experience.
