John Dunn graduated from Wilson in **1973** and played basketball and baseball (all-PIL West guard in basketball, all-PIL at pitcher and third base, all-state as senior, two-time all-NorPac in baseball at PSU, all-Northwest League pitcher in 1977 for Portland Mavericks); coached baseball.

Dave Gammon graduated from Wilson in **1962** and played football, basketball and baseball (all-state and twice all-PIL in baseball, State-Metro all-star); golf teaching pro.

*John Miller (deceased) graduated from Wilson in 1966 and is honored for his achievements in wrestling (twice state runner-up, won two Pac-8 titles at UO with one NCAA crown to go with fourth-and fifth-place finishes).

Tom Sandt graduated from Wilson in **1989** and played basketball and baseball (member of 1989 PIL and state basketball title team, three-time all-PIL in baseball, all-state once, part of '89 PIL champs that placed second in state, State-Metro all-star, four years of baseball at Northwestern followed by one year in San Diego Padres organization).

The Carl Cadonau family, Alpenrose Dairy, was given a **Merit Award** for their efforts as longtime baseball and softball supporters.

DENTAL EXPLORING PROGRAM

OHSU's Dental Exploring Program is in its twenty-second year of providing participants with a general perception of what a career in dentistry is all about. Participating high school students have been very enthusiastic about their experience, and many of them have successfully matriculated to dental school. Monthly two-hour meetings are held at the dental school with an emphasis on "hands-on" activities. The first hour is composed of a lecture from dental school faculty from a variety of disciplines, while the second hour is a laboratory experience. Dental students organize the monthly meetings and act as mentors. Space is limited to sixty participants and is reserved on a first come, first serve basis. A complete application, both consent forms and the \$30 fee must be on file to reserve a space.
