Wilson Counselor Kathryn Wolff got the opportunity to watch the dress rehearsal of *ABLAZE* last week. Here's what she has to say...

"I've got to tell you – this production was absolutely incredible, an experience well beyond what one would expect from a high school show. The story is gripping and addresses real issues many of our students face, but often keep well-hidden. The acting was stellar; even though I knew many of the kids in the show it was not difficult to be transported to their stage characters and become fully engrossed in their stories. The music was AMAZING! Complicated rhythms and melodies all performed flawlessly and a cappella – every single performer did a fantastic job. The music was also so accessible – it became just part of the story to the point that I was hardly aware they were singing.

I'm a big fan of the arts, it's true. But I have to say last night's performance was one of the most impactful, transportive theater experiences I've ever had. And, it is happening right here in our own "backyard." If you love the arts – this show is not to be missed. If you haven't ever attended a show here – this is the one you should attend!
