GRADUATE DARES TO PLAY WITHOUT A SAFETY NET

Luis Perez graduated from Wilson in 1986. He later graduated from Portland State University (after a short period at Purdue University) and went onto graduate school at both Yale University and Princeton University. Luis taught at Reed College and Columbia University before moving to France where he lectured at the Sorbonne, Sciences Po, the Ecole Normale Superieure and eventually became Dean of International Academic Affairs for a world-renowned design school in Paris. Luis is presently a Gates Scholar at the University of Cambridge, with St. Catharine's College and the Centre of Latin American Studies. He is a specialist in Caribbean Cultural Studies (literature, politics, economics, anthropology, urbanism and history) and deals with the English, French and Spanish countries in the region. His current book project is on Aesthetics and Ideology in contemporary Cuban cultural productions. He fondly recalls that George Penk and Ron Zaraza changed his life. "Mr. Penk showed me that one must be in control of the internal self, Mr. Zaraza showed me that one must let the chaos of the universe flow through you". He tells us that both teachers challenged his intellect. When asked about advice for current students, Luis suggests that "the best one can do to prepare for life is to play hard, to work harder and most of all to not take 'no' for an answer". He says that "what I have learned through my varied and -yes, very lucky- educational and professional experiences is to focus not on the problems/the questions, but on the answers. It matters not that the impossible figures among these (it's called brainstorming for a reason) but limiting yourself to only consider the possible leads to mediocrity and complacency. Innovation requires spiritual creativity as much as intellectual rigour: think outside of the box, and dare to play without a safety net."

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SUN SCHOOL FUNDING THREATENED

Funding cuts are being proposed that could seriously reduce funding for the SUN (Schools Uniting Neighborhoods) program. The SUN programs at Robert Gray Middle School, Jackson Middle School, and Markham Elementary School have been identified as some of the programs most likely to be cut. The SUN program is focused on "at-risk" children and their families and brings together a range of resources to help them succeed in school and beyond. A key reason that the SUN programs in Southwest Portland are at risk for being cut is that this section of the city has a lower percentage of at-risk students than some other sections of Portland. The irony is that, in areas of the city with higher rates of poverty and at-risk students, there are a variety of other resources and programs available in the community. In Southwest Portland, on the other hand, the SUN program is one of the only programs available to provide support to at-risk students. If this program is cut, there aren't other local resources available to fill the gap. With all of the cuts that our schools have endured year-after-year, it is time tell our politicians that schools, and children, have to take priority. In Portland, SUN School funding comes from the City of Portland Parks & Recreation budget and from the Portland Children's Levy. Some funding also comes from Multnomah County. SW HOPE: FEED THE HUNGRY 2012 KICKS OFF

More than 60 faith communities, businesses and community groups are teaming up for the 6th annual SW HOPE food and fundraising drive, runs through April 1, 2012. The goal of SW HOPE is to raise 150,000 pounds of food, or the cash equivalent, to support Neighborhood House's Emergency Food Box Program, the largest on Portland's west side, which provides food assistance to approximately 500 families each month. Over the last two years, usage of the Neighborhood House Emergency Food Box program has seen an increase of almost 90% due to the decline in the economy and the increasing unemployment rate. In the last six months, Neighborhood House has distributed an average of 600 boxes a month, feeding approximately 1,800 individuals. We are requesting support from the greater community to feed the most vulnerable and assist our disadvantaged neighbors, so many of whom are experiencing particularly great need at this time.
