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COMMUNITY MEETING FOR SELECTION OF NEXT WILSON PRINCIPAL, APRIL 16

With the retirement of Wilson High School Principal Sue Brent, you are invited to attend the Community Meeting on Monday, April 16 at 6:30-8:00pm in the Wilson Library. Staff, parents, and students (present and future) are invited to attend this meeting - your ideas and input are important! The community meeting is one of the first steps taken in our principal hiring process. The Director of Administrative Hiring, John Blanck and Trip Goodall, the High School Regional Administrator, will come to Wilson and meet with teachers, staff, and parents together. The purpose of the meeting is to hear what you think is special about your school. We want to know about your programs, demographics, parent involvement, special projects, etc., and about the type of person you would like to have as your permanent Principal. This information helps us select candidates that have qualifications that support those elements. At the meeting we will also take time to explain the full hiring process. We will explain two main possibilities: a) how the Community Meeting information may be used with the Regional Administrators to place a current Principal because of a great match between the school and that Principal, or b) if a match is not selected by the Regional Administrators, applicants chosen will go through a rigorous process to be selected for interviews. YOUNG WOMEN INTERESTED IN BEING A FIREFIGHTER?

Are you a young woman between the age of 16 and 19 who is interested in learning what being a firefighter is all about? Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) is offering a three day fire training camp specifically for young women ages 16 to 19 to be held June 22nd through the 24th, 2012 at PF&R's Training & Safety Facility located at 4800 NE 122nd Avenue in Portland, Oregon. The goals of Fire Camp are to instill confidence, build leadership and team skills in young women, and to provide an opportunity to try firefighting through hands-on training. Fire Camp participants will be involved in hands-on activities, including: Orientation-Tour of the facilities, bunker drill, basic overview of activities, expectations, discussion of fire and fire extinguishers, practical exercise with fire hoses and fire extinguishers; Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA): Physical exercise drills, team building exercise, familiarization of SCBA, SCBA exercises, search and rescue techniques using the SCBA, teamwork exercises; High Angle Rescue, Confined Space: Physical exercise drills, team building exercise, watch an interior fire go through the stages of fire development, high angle rescue techniques, confined space rescue; Vehicle Extrication and Hands-on Medical Instruction: Physical exercise drills, team building exercise, visit a fire station, become familiar with different firefighting equipment and apparatus, vehicle extrication exercise, medical and a ladder exercise; Demonstrations: Scenario work using all the equipment, public demonstration showing the knowledge and skills acquired throughout Fire Camp Fire Camp will be held at no cost to participants. This is a non-residential camp. Participants are responsible for their own transportation to/from camp. Applications for Fire Camp 2012 will be accepted through May 23.
