Comments from Matthew B. Zrebski, writer / director of Ablaze

"If I had a single regret from our successful November and January runs of the show, it was that too few teenagers actually got to see it. *Ablaze* was written with a very specific audience in mind. I, of course, hope it appeals to *all* audiences, but the story clearly centers around the teen experience. In Salem, we were in front of a thousand teenagers. When that crowd launched to their feet at the end - screaming, cheering, and crying - I was so thrilled. As a teaching artist, I could not have been happier for the students to receive such well deserved accolades; they worked so hard and earned that ovation. Wilson's program under **Jamie Miller**'s leadership is truly extraordinary, and to showcase the talent was such a wonderful opportunity. And as the creator of the piece, I was relieved to know that indeed the material had impact on this young audience - and that hopefully, it can live on to be produced elsewhere. We always hope that the work we do as theatre artists can enjoy longevity. Time will tell if *Ablaze* can sustain. Regardless, this journey with this phenomenal and gifted company of ferocious young performers will forever be a highlight of my career. As I said to them in Salem, they have truly become a family to me...and I think we will all remember this experience forever. I feel very blessed and hope these students have gained from this project even a fraction of what I have gained from working with them."
