### WILSON STUDENTS EARN TOP HONORS AT OREGON GAME PROJECT CHALLENGE

TechStart Education Foundation, along with sponsors ETIC and Branium, held the fifth annual Oregon Game Game Project Challenge (OGPC 5.0) on Saturday, April 28 where 49 teams and 275 students and coaches from around Oregon and southern Washington competed in a statewide computer game development competition designed to educate and propose solutions to urban planning challenges. **Wilson's "Ballmer Peak" team** won top honors with **Best in Show** in the high school division. Wilson's winning team consisted of: **Zach Swafford**, **Duncan Millard**, **Teddy Duchow-Pressley**, **Jonah George** and **Aaron Schilling** and their game "Chronopolis." **Chris Bartlo**, Wilson teacher and team coach says, "The team was recognized for their technical excellence, game design, development plan, professionalism and teamwork! This is the fifth year OGPC (Oregon Game Project Challenge) has been held and the second year we have competed (last year we had teams win the Teamwork award and the Best Rookie Team). This year four teams from Wilson competed and all of our teams put out an amazing effort, designing some impressive games and represented our program well! It is the biggest programming event/competition in the state, so it was a pretty big deal for us and we hope to use this to grow interest in the program!" Mr. Bartlo teaches Computer Science, Systems Dynamics and Mathematical Modeling and Functions, Statistics and Trig. Principal Sue Brent beams when talking about this program at Wilson. "We're so proud of these young people. Chris Bartlo has done a great job, and the program at Wilson is bulging at the seams."
