WILSON ART TEACHER WINS MILLER AWARD

Marie Pearson, Art Teacher at Wilson High School, was awarded \$5,000 for the 2012-2013 school year from the James F. and Marion L. Miller Foundation. This teaching award will pay for professional development, art supplies, and equipment. According to the Miller Foundation, a major problem facing public high schools is the large number of teachers who drop out of the profession during their first five years of teaching. In Oregon this attrition was 37 percent, according to a 2008 report by the Chalkboard Project. To encourage more teachers to stay in the profession and improve their skills, the Miller Foundation offers professional development awards annually to provide public high school teachers with opportunities for growth and development, with the goal of strengthening their commitment to, interest in, and effectiveness in a long-term classroom teaching career. The ultimate goal is helping teachers pursue activities that will stimulate and nurture student achievement. The awards range from \$1,000 to \$5,000, depending upon the nature of the individual projects. Congratulations, Marie! Exciting news for the visual arts students at Wilson!

THE TEMPEST: ANOTHER ARTISTIC WOW-SER FOR WILSON DRAMA

Wilson Drama recently completed an entertaining, lightning-quick eight performances in ten days (May 9-18) run of William Shakespeare's The Tempest. Mounted in barely a month's time from casting to first performance, this rollicking version -- presented to audiences in the intimate Auditorium Stage setting -- was notable for its fast-pace (two hours, including intermission) and crowd-pleasing innovations. For example, Director Jamie M. Miller introduced a full-throttle pantomime by the Spirits to accompany Prospera's opening monologue that establishes the dramatic situation at the beginning of the play. He also cast Ariel as twin alter-egos (played by Scout Smythe and Grame Montgomery) who finished each other's lines and mirrored each others moves with eerie precision. **Jesse Turner** proved a suitably magisterial (and occasionally vexed) Prospera; Andy Thoennes a pure and dewey-eyed Miranda. Alex Diaz-Hui was as churlish, a fish-scaled Caliban as his brother, **Nick Diaz-Hui**, was a suave and appealing Ferdinand. Among many memorable turns in supporting roles, Sally Loughney delighted as the housemaid Stephana, playing the part somewhere between Falstaff and Raggedy Ann Doll; Colin Scannell was an embittered, scheming Antonio and Lucy Schwimmer was a tart-tongued, wickedly funny Sebastiane. The play was visually compelling; all performers wore individually-stylized masks giving the production a sophisticated, Greek-fusion feel. Original music by **Ethan Conroy** set the mood. As has become a hallmark of recent productions, alumni with theater expertise came back to Wilson to lend their expertise - Claire-Liis Hillier '04 in choreography and Natalie Heikkinen '04 in costume design.
