Pulled the No. 2 oar for the eight that won the 2012 Temple Cup at the Henley Royal Regatta. PSAT/NMSQT Test at Wilson, OCTOBER 17

All sophomores will take the **PSAT/NMSQT** test on **Wednesday**, **October 17** at Wilson High. Oregon Dept. of Education provides this test, at no charge, to all sophomores. Each high school will administer it to their own students on this day. No pre-registration is needed for sophomores – this will happen in class. Juniors are encouraged to sign up to take the test as well for a chance to compete for the National Merit Scholarship. The cost is **\$20 for juniors** to take the test and you can sign up with our bookkeeper now through **October 3rd**. The cost is **\$5** for students on Free & Reduced lunch. If other financial assistance is needed, please see Abby Menashe in the main office. All grades will have school that day starting at **8:15am**. There will be changes to the bell schedule that day which will be explained in advance. The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) is a national standardized assessment that measures various skills your students will need for higher education and careers after high school. It provides firsthand practice for the SAT[®] and gain access to college and career planning tools. It also gives juniors a chance to enter NMSC scholarship programs.
