Oregon Report Card ratings for Oregon's K-12 public schools and districts were recently released, and Wilson continues to shine as a strong, vibrant, and successful school with an "Outstanding" rating. A school's overall designation on the report card is determined by a rating system which looks at student achievement on state reading and math tests, growth in student achievement, participation on reading and math tests, and graduation or attendance rates. How well a school does in these areas determines whether they are identified as Outstanding, Satisfactory, or In Need of Improvement. WILSON SPEAKERS MAKE STRONG START

On Saturday, October 6, Trojan Speech and Debate came out swinging at the first tournament of the year, at Sam Barlow High School in Gresham. 21 schools attended the tournament, which featured a special opportunity for novice speakers to observe experienced “open division” students while competing themselves. TEEN ATHLETE CARDIAC SCREENING, OCTOBER 20

Randall Children's Hospital at Legacy Emanuel is hosting its annual Teen Athlete Cardiac Screening on Sat, October 20. This low-cost screening checks student athletes ages 13-19 for potential heart problems that can lead to sudden cardiac arrest. The screening takes about an hour - includes an electrocardiogram (ECG); height, weight, body mass index (BMI) measurements; and a cardiac physical exam. Cardiologists, pediatricians and health care professionals perform the test, and families receive results at the screening. Sat, October 20, 8:30am to 2pm at adidas Village Portland. Cost: \$10. STUDENTS INVITED TO "ENTER THE DEBATE CONTEST, DEADLINE NOVEMBER 2

McGraw-Hill Education, a social studies learning system, is inviting middle and high school students to submit entries for its "Enter the Debate" contest. Open to students in grades 6-12, the contest calls for teachers to assign students to write an essay suggesting a potential debate question for President Obama and Governor Romney and have students explain why the question is important to the nation.
