TEACHERS IMPACT A STUDENT'S LIFE

Kevin Rawls graduated from Wilson in **2012** and was accepted at the **University of Washington** in Seattle where he plans to study Engineering. This fall he auditioned with his tenor sax and was accepted into the **Husky Marching Band**. Kevin's musical career reluctantly began in 6th grade at Robert Gray MS. He was put in choir and tried everything to get out. That is until he met **Jeanne Berg**, RGMS music teacher. Kevin told his parents (**Julie and KC Rawls**) that he had never met a teacher like Jeanne. With support from Ms. Berg, Kevin sang in the choir and in the "Panache" vocal group and played the clarinet in the band all through middle school. When Kevin got to Wilson he sang with both **Steve Peter** and **Margaret Murer** in the "Wilsingers". "His favorite place to sing is the chapel at the Grotto," adds Julie "because the acoustics are so wonderful in there. We always looked forward to this performance each year." Kevin continued in band at Wilson and moved on to mastering the bass clarinet. **Paul Jolstead** encouraged Kevin to join the jazz band. To do this Kevin took up the tenor saxophone and had to be at school by 7:30 a.m. each day for practice. Julie remembers that Paul Jolstead was very encouraging to Kevin and one of the biggest thrills she had as a parent was watching Kevin perform with the All State Honor Band in Eugene.

Today in college, Kevin joins the ranks of approximately 240 students who play in the University of Washington Husky Marching Band. He also keeps up his bass clarinet skills by playing in the University of Washington Concert Band. He has an intense schedule this fall taking a full load of classes while also attending two-hour evening rehearsals with the band and playing at all home football games. Kevin will perform for the Apple Cup and will travel to Pullman, WA for the Washington/Washington State game over Thanksgiving weekend. The Husky Marching Band recently played at a Seattle Seahawks home game and Kevin said it was an incredible experience to play and march in front of 70,000 spectators. According to his parents, music has played a huge role in Kevin's life. "There is no doubt his life would have a huge hole in it if he hadn't met Jeanne Berg and Paul Jolstead. Our family can never thank them enough for all the long hours they put in at rehearsals, marching drills, concerts, parades, and music trips," states Julie. "They are a testament to the incredible impact a teacher can have on a child's life. Our teachers deserve acknowledgement and thanks for their outstanding dedication and the huge impact they make in young people's lives. Thank you!

INSPIRATIONAL TEACHER AWARDS

The Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts is seeking nominations for the 2013 Kennedy Center/Stephen Sondheim Inspirational Teacher Awards, a series of annual grants that recognize inspiring teachers in the United States. Now in their third year, the awards were created in honor of American composer and lyricist Stephen Sondheim, who frequently attributes his success to the teachers in his life. The awards are presented each year on Sondheim's birthday — March 22 — to a handful of teachers, kindergarten through college, who are nominated via the Kennedy Center Web site. To be eligible, nominees must be legal residents of the U.S. Nominations must be based on experience as a full-time classroom teacher in a K-12 school in the U.S. or as a college or university instructor in the U.S. Nominators must be at least 18 years of age and have been a student of the nominee. Nominations for teachers by peers, parents, relatives, or other individuals based on non-teacher-student interactions will not be reviewed. Last year, ten teachers were recognized for their outstanding influence on students. The recipients each received a \$10,000 prize and their stories, as told by the nominating student, were featured on a Web site dedicated to inspirational teachers. Deadline: December 16, 2012.
