OREGON STUDENT POETRY CONTEST, DEADLINE FEBRUARY 1

The Oregon Poetry Association (OPA) is sponsoring the fifteenth annual Oregon Student Poetry Contest. All Oregon students, kindergarten through 12th grade (enrolled in public, private, parochial and alternative schools, and home schooled) are invited to submit a poem. There is no entry fee. The deadline for entries is February 1, 2013 (postmark). Teams of OPA members that include established Oregon poets and poetry teachers will judge the poems. Ten winners each in four age categories receive cash prizes ranging from \$5 for honorable mentions to \$30 for first place. All forty winning poems will be published in Cascadia: The Oregon Student Poetry Contest Anthology. Each winner will receive a certificate and a copy of the anthology. The winning poems and honorable mentions in the middle and high school divisions will be sent to the annual Manningham Trust Student Contest sponsored by the National Federation of State Poetry Societies (NSFPS). This national competition also awards cash prizes and publication in an anthology. Writing poetry to enter in the contest is typically a class project organized by teachers in the various types of schools. OPA urges parents and teachers to encourage students to enter the contest. This is an excellent opportunity both to encourage and to reward creativity in Oregon students.
