WILSON POOL LIFEGUARDS HAILED AS 'HEROIC' AFTER SAVING 13 YEAR-OLD'S LIFE On November 28, 2012, Portland Fire and Rescue presented the Fire Chief's Certificate of Merit to the following Wilson Pool Lifeguards:

The award was for their life saving efforts on 7/19/12 when a 13 year-old girl was unconscious at the bottom of the Wilson Pool. They worked as a team to pull the girl from the water, give her rescue breathing until she started breathing on her own, clear the pool, place her in the recovery position, and work with fire and rescue personnel upon their arrival. Quoting the award, "They acted according to their training and worked as a team to coordinate fast action that produced a positive result. In this instance they truly earned the title of Lifeguard."

INTRODUCING PEER COUNSELING AT WILSON NEXT YEAR!

Peer Counseling is a new program coming to our school in 2013-2014! The program is being developed as a new elective class that will help students develop skills and knowledge to contribute to the well-being of our school community in their role as goodwill ambassadors of Wilson High School. This course will introduce students to empathetic listening skills and community resources and will serve as a potent learning experience for those considering careers in the helping professions. Topics covered will include: family issues, grief, stress, depression and suicide, substance abuse, relationship challenges, and interpersonal violence.

WHS Peer Counselors will be active in many opportunities to make a positive difference at our school, including:

- Staff a peer-counseling drop in space.
- Orient and welcome new students to WHS.
- Give presentations to our feeder elementary and middle schools on a variety of topics related to making good choices and being successful in high school.
- Work together with Leadership to sponsor activities and projects to promote a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere at Wilson.
- Present to Wilson students in sophomore health and freshman ACE classes addressing topics such as: Stress management, bullying, school motivation and success, teen suicide, sexual assault and harassment, and building healthy relationships.

GIVE THE GIFT OF ALL WEATHER TURF

In an effort to replace the Wilson High School grass field in the stadium with all weather turf, the **Wilson Fields Improvement Project** (<u>http://wilsonfields.org/WilsonField.html</u>) was formed by a group of dedicated and generous alumni and supporters in the community. This is part of the larger, Places for Sport program, which is refurbishing all of the PIL high school tracks and fields to synthetic playing surfaces. We are proud and excited to have signed on to help and we have been offered significant financial pledges to fund a new field with the requirement that we have the broadbased support of the Wilson community. The project goal is to raise \$1.2 million to replace the existing WHS grass athletic stadium field with an all-weather synthetic turf field. To date with early contributors we have raised approximately \$90,000. Our fund raising goal is absolutely doable and has already been accomplished by Roosevelt, Cleveland, Lincoln and Benson. It's our turn!

The new surface will significantly increase availability, provide opportunities for community use, reduce year-round maintenance costs and give Wilson a safer surface resistant to the ravages of Oregon weather. Artificial turf will enable Wilson High School's outstanding sports teams to host "home" playoff games on our field instead of requiring our students to travel to other area high schools' fields. No longer will Wilson athletes be driving across town to play the most meaningful and memorable games of their high school careers.
