WILSON ACTORS TO OPEN IN PROFESSIONAL WORLD PREMIERE, April 12 - May 5 Wilson Actors to open in the professional world premiere of Ablaze: An a Cappella Musical Thriller! In early 2011 the Wilson theater department commissioned a new work by playwright Matthew **Zrebski**, and in November 2011 premiered *Ablaze: An A Cappella Musical Thriller*. Following a sold-out production at Wilson High School Ablaze continued to astound audiences and critics alike at the Fertile Ground Festival in early 2012. In April 2012 it was featured at the State Thespian Festival as one of the top three high school productions for 2011-12, and was performed at the historic Elsinore Theatre in Salem for an audience of 1,100 theater students and professionals.
