REMEMBERING JACKIE ROBINSON

According to The New York Times, David Zaslow, a rabbi in Ashland, Ore., had an idea to expand and pay tribute to Jackie Robinson the first baseball player to break Major League Baseball's color barrier that segregated the sport for more than 50 years. Zaslow started Campaign 42, a project that helps ballplayers of all ages across the country wear No. 42 on their jerseys, to coincide with the Jackie Robinson Day celebration in Major League Baseball. On April 15, 2013 nearly 2,600 players ages 4 to 18 wore No. 42 stickers on a sleeve or the front of their jerseys. On that day, all Wilson High School baseball players wore number 42 on their jersey. Zaslow enlisted two of his former bar mitzvah students to spearhead the project. Jack Carroll (Ashland High School senior) and **Jonah Harris** (**Wilson junior and catcher**) recruited most of the participants from leagues in Oregon, but the two young baseball players also attracted others in Boulder, Colo., and Pittsburgh. "Kids are not just handed a sticker and told to wear it," Harris said. He added: "If a sticker is what gets the conversation started, so be it. But it needs to start somewhere." WILSON PROGRAMS WAY TO 3RD PLACE AT TECHSTART PROGRAMMING CONTEST Congratulations to **Teddy Duchow-Pressley**, **Zack Swafford**, **James Waugh** and **Joe Weissig** on their 3rd Place finish at the Willamette University's TechStart State Programming competition on April 20, 2013. The team was coach by **Chris Bartlo** (Wilson Advanced Math teacher). This year's contest problems involved such topics as multi-dimensional hypercube edge traversal, polynomexpression parsing and the generation of Google-maps style street directions. The contest is held at Willamette University. Each team brings one computer. A set of 12 to 14 problems is distributed to the teams. The students write programs to solve as many of these problems as they can. They divide tasks among themselves and work cooperatively in any way they wish. If the team submitted program is judged for style, legibility and flexibility. Trophies are awarded to the top three teams.

Willamette University Associate Professor Fritz Ruehr, the contest director, said "the contest is a fun way to inspire students to achieve more than they thought they could: the friendly but competitive nature of the contest really gets them to think on their feet and do great stuff. Wilson's team this year solved 6 problems, including a couple of favorites of mine: one involved a 17th century math problem about how all numbers can be expressed as the sum of four squares; the other was inspired by a popular t-short style that expresses words using symbols from the periodic table of elements. They did a remarkable job and I look forward to seeing them in the contest again!"
