## **DEAR WILSON COMMUNITY**

Linked below is an exchange of letters between Superintendent Carole Smith and the Parents Coalitions outlining an agreed upon path forward for supporting our high schools students.

A month ago, we mobilized to send a message to the school district leadership that we would not allow a further disinvestment in our high schools and that parents and students would no longer accept a shortened school day, with early dismissal, late arrival and mandatory study halls for our students.

Over the past several weeks we have worked closely with Superintendent Smith and members of the school board to strengthen our high schools. The attached exchange of letters between PPS and the Parents Coalitions are direct result of an open and productive series of discussions with Superintendent Smith.

We have agreed on the following:

1. The Superintendent is recommending to add/redirect 58 additional teachers into the high schools (needs to be ratified by the School Board tomorrow night)
2. The Coalition encouraged and supported Supt. Smith in lifting the 7-class limit on high school students
3. Superintendent Smith will construct a strategic framework for our high schools by January 15, 2014 (in advance of the next budget year) to ensure all high school students who want or need a full school day will have one, and that the high school schedule will comply with the state instructional standards (annual hours and instructional hours), and is adequately staffed
4. Data on high school schedules will be shared with the parent community
5. Study halls will be instructionally focused, and there will be a series of data points for parents and students to assess the effectiveness of the new format.

Many thanks to you for being the champions for our students!

And, we all owe Superintendent Smith a thank you for working with us the past several weeks to create a better future for Portland high school students. Please take a moment to email/thank her for her leadership.
