STANDOUTS FOR COLLEGE BASEBALL'S TOP HONOR INCLUDES WILSON GRAD

The National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association has released the names of semifinalists for the 2013 Dick Howser Trophy given to top NCAA Division I College Baseball players, based on two rounds of national voting. **Brent Graham class of 2009** was nominated as a semifinalist. Brent is a senior and shortstop at Campbell University in North Carolina. The finalists will be announced June 6th and awarded on June 15th, the opening day of the 2013 College World Series. The Dick Howser Trophy is given in memory of the former Florida State University All-America shortstop and major league player and manager, who died of brain cancer in 1987. This award is regarded by many as college baseball's most prestigious award. Brent is also on the Brooks Robinson Award Watch List, given to the nation's top shortstop. Brent was the varsity shortstop at Wilson as a sophomore, junior and senior. He was 1st team PIL all-league and 2nd team all-state.
