### **ENVIRONMENTAL CONTEST FOR MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS**

Lexus Eco Challenge is an educational program and contest designed to inspire and empower middle and high school students in US to learn about the environment and take action to improve it. The program will award a total of \$500,000 in grants and scholarships. Competition open to students in grades 6-12, who are either registered and home-schooled or enrolled in a public or accredited private school, and who are legal residents of the U.S. or the District of Columbia. Teams of students can enter if they are part of an afterschool science or environmental club; the challenge is not open to clubs outside of school. Middle and high school teams of five to ten students and a teacher-advisor are invited to participate in one or both of the two initial challenges, each addressing different environmental elements: land/water and air/climate. Teams define environmental issue that is important to them, develop an action plan to address the issue. implement the plan, and report the results. Submission deadline for Challenge 1 (land/water) is Oct 7, 2013; deadline for Challenge 2 (air/climate) is Nov 11, 2013. Each of the challenges will have sixteen winning entries — eight middle school and eight high school teams. Winning teams each will receive a total of \$10,000 in scholarships and grants, to be shared among the students, teacher, and school. In early January, the winning teams from the first two challenges will be invited to participate in the program's final challenge (deadline: Jan 17, 2014). From the final challenge entries, eight first-place teams and two grand prize-winning teams will be selected. Each of the eight first-place teams will receive a total of \$15,000 in grants and scholarships, and two grand prize-winning teams will each receive \$30,000. Money will be shared by the students, their teacher-advisors, and their schools. Registration opens September 2. ### KIDS IN NEED FOUNDATION INVITES APPLICATIONS FOR TEACHER GRANTS PROGRAM

The Kids In Need Foundation, a national nonprofit organization dedicated to providing free school supplies to economically disadvantaged school children and underfunded teachers, is accepting applications from K-12 teachers for grants to support classroom projects. Grants of up to \$500 will be awarded to educators for projects that strengthen creativity, critical thinking skills, and/or core knowledge by engaging students in the learning process. Typically, 300 to 600 grants are awarded each year. Grants will be awarded by independent sponsors including ArtSkills, Office Depot, Jo-Ann Fabric and Craft Stores, the Fred Meyer Fund, and VIA Credit Union. Some of these sponsors restrict donations by geographic region and grade level. Teachers may only apply to one sponsor per project. All certified K-12 teachers in the US are eligible.
