The Wilson Cross Country team ran an impressive meet against Cleveland, Roosevelt, Jefferson and Gladstone. Wilson finished a close second to Cleveland in the both varsity races. The JV teams dominated the competition with the first 7 finishers in the women's race and 10 of the first 12 runners in the men's race.

Over 95 Wilson runners competed in the meet, with 65 runners recording personal best times for a 5K race (3.1 miles). Varsity runner Olivia Stein ran an impressive 19:24 (6:15 min/mile) finishing in 2nd overall. Freshman sensation Sydney Brieher ran an outstanding 20:08 for 3rd overall. The men's team ran in a strong pack of five runners, lead by Jack Howard finishing in 17:05(5:30 min/mile).
