Wilson freshman **Natalie Hall**, currently on the Wilson Women's JV Soccer team, spent over two weeks playing soccer in Denmark and Sweden this summer with the Tacoma-based Benson Soccer USA (not to be confused with Benson High School). They participated in and became the champions of the Dana Cup in Frederikshavn, Denmark. The Benson USA team then headed to Gothenburg, Sweden to participate in the Gothia World Youth Cup, which is the largest soccer tournament in the world with over 37,000 participants competing from 75 nations. Natalie and her teammates advanced from group play, to the Gothia Cup finals, ultimately losing a hard-fought championship game 0-2 against Sweden.
