LONG GREEN LINE

October 24th was the "Long Green Line" where **Wilson Cross Country** showed up in force at the 2013 5A PIL District Championship with over 110 athletes! To start the afternoon off, our JV Girls absolutely demolished their competition with a lead pack of Trojans included Freshman **Ivy Schreiber**, **Constandina Brown**, sophomore **Lillianne Barberis**, and Juniors **Caelan Murray** and **Lilly Emmerick**. The future is extremely bright for this group of up & comers! The JV Boys placed a respectable third in a very competitive JV division. Sophomores **Aiden Nelson** and **Xavier Triplett** both finished in the top ten. Aiden finished 5th overall with a time of 18:08 and Xavier "the X-man" was 8th overall with a time of 18:19 (that's less than 6 minute miles for 3.1 miles).

However, the main events for the afternoon were in the Varsity divisions. At the district championships only the top two placing teams and top five individuals qualify for the opportunity to compete at the state meet in Eugene, on November 2nd. The Varsity men's team (**Jack & Chase Howard**, **Chris Nussbaum**, **Arnold Grabski**, **Nick Slenning**, **Caleb Seeley** and **Sam Berhrens**) ran their hearts out, yet finished an extremely close **third place** to Benson and Cleveland. Junior **Jack Howard** ran like the wind and finished 4th overall, **qualifying him for state** as an individual and becoming a member of the 2013 PIL all-league team. Sophomore **Chris Nussbaum** also made the PIL all-league team by finishing in 7th position.

The big news of the day was in the Women's division. The Lady Trojans (**Olivia Stein**, **Sydney Brieher**, **Alina Nussbaum**, **Shea Sims**, **Alyssa Bell-Padgett**, **Kendra Zimmerdahl & Dana Nathanson**) finished **2nd overall** and **qualified**, **as a team**, **for the state meet**. This is the first time since 1990(!) that the Lady Trojans will represent our league at that state meet. Highlighting the day was Junior super-star **Olivia Stein** who placed 2nd overall and Freshman sensation **Sydney Brieher** 4th overall (both all-league athletes). Now it's on to state!
