Hello Wilson Community! Wilson seniors are conducting their **GRADUATION NIGHT PARTY fundraiser:** Our seniors are selling frozen Willamette Valley pies, cobblers and bags of fruit. For those of you not familiar with Willamette Valley, they are a local company providing home made pies, cobblers and bagged fruit from fresh local produce. They use all natural ingredients and there are no preservatives. If you have never had a Willamette Valley pie or cobbler, it tastes just like homemade, because each pie and cobbler is handmade in Salem, Oregon. They come frozen. All you have to do is bake them and they are awesome, fresh and hot out of your oven! The piecrust is flakey like grandmas. Because they use local fruit, each bite tastes like summer.

We are selling each handmade pie for \$18, cobblers for \$12, fruit bags for \$10 and cases of mini pies, 10 oz. (6 per case) for \$30. PIE OF THE MONTH: For the holidays, Willamette Valley is featuring their Apple-Cran Crunch pie. Our new holiday pie is a mix of sliced Granny Smith Apples with a healthy dose of Oregon Cranberries. It is then topped with our crunch topping. This blend of ground almonds, butter a sprinkle of cinnamon and a few special ingredients allow this to brown and form a delicious crunch "crust." Sure to give you and your family a special Holiday treat.

She will be getting free tickets for Ann Patchett's lecture at the Arlene Schnitzer Concert Hall. Parents can join their students as well. Ms. Patchett's new is "The Story of a Happy Marriage". Here is a review from Amazon by Donna Seaman.

Starred Review This is the story of how best-selling novelist Patchett (State of Wonder, 2011) became a writer. As a young child in California and, after her parents' divorce, Nashville, she knew she had to write, and she was fortunate, as she so warmly and vividly explains, in her writing teachers—Allan Gurganus, Grace Paley, and Russell Banks-and in her success supporting herself by writing nonfiction for magazines and newspapers, beginning with Seventeen and extending to the New York Times Magazine, GQ, Vogue, and Gourmet. Patchett now assembles a retrospective set of 22 sterling personal essays to form an episodic, piquant, instructive, and entertaining self-portrait. She reflects on her family, life on a Tennessee farm, literary discipline and inspiration, and her failed first marriage. Her second marriage is central to her hilarious account of an RV road trip, and the full measure of Patchett's toughness and daring surfaces in "The Wall," a riveting account of her father, a captain when he retired after 30 years on the Los Angeles police force, coaching her as she takes the grueling admission test for the Los Angeles Police Academy. A self-described "workhorse" who has even opened an independent bookstore, Patchett is a commanding and incisive storyteller, whether her tales are true or imagined.
