#### STUDENT WINNERS FOR SOCK IT TO ME CONTEST



### WILSON STUDENTS CREATE MORE INFORMED AND MOTIVATED GENERATION

Local Girl Scout Ambassador senior Raichle Dunkeld. Wilson High School, reaches out to a community of youth with Project Evergreen. Raichle, a 10-year veteran in Girl Scouts, competes for the prestigious Gold Award through the Girl Scout Council. Seeking involvement from the Students for Environmental Action Club (SEA), she led a group of Wilson high students in the spring of 2013 to instruct the 8th grade class at Robert Gray Middle School about environmental awareness in the Pacific Northwest. The principal of RGMS, Ms. Beth Madison and the science teachers agreed for Raichle and her team to spend a day at Robert Gray educating the 8th grade science classes. Through organized meetings with members of the SEA Club, Raichle led the team to create environmental objectives that were presented to the 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. The team members took on several class periods and taught subjects with experiential learning techniques and overhead projections such as nuclear energy pros and cons, hydro-fracturing, deforestation and forestry, oceanography, and the highly controversial Nestle Bottling Plant proposal in Cascade Locks. The small groups were surveyed in the spring of 2013 during this intervention and will be surveyed again at the December event. Many of those same 8th graders will foster insight as freshmen as Raichle will provide additional outreach to the freshman homeroom classes at Wilson High. The final presentation is a planned assembly at Wilson High School during homeroom, with follow up with discussions led by the Students for Environmental Action Club. Raichle has acquired local professionals in the field of environmental action to provide insight to the everchanging issues of environmental activism. PIE OF THE MONTH: For the holidays, Willamette Valley is featuring their Apple-Cran Crunch pie. Our new holiday pie is a mix of sliced Granny Smith Apples with a healthy dose of Oregon Cranberries. It is then topped with our crunch topping. This blend of ground almonds, butter a sprinkle of cinnamon and a few special ingredients allow this to brown and form a delicious crunch "crust."
