In the debates, congratulations to Edward Szczepanski and Michael Streinz (tie for 3rd place Public Forum Debate). Edward placed 1st and Michael 3rd for individual speaker awards in Public Forum. Congratulations to Eli Morgan-Steiner and Chris Meabe (1st place Parliamentary Debate) and to Chris for taking 1st place individual speaker for Parliamentary Debate. The team competes next at Glencoe High School on Saturday, January 18th.
