WILSON SENIOR NAMED SEMI-FINALIST IN ‘STAMPS’ SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Raichle Dunkeld, Wilson High School senior, was selected as a state Stamps Scholarship Semi-Finalist with the University of Oregon. There were over 200 applicants for this scholarship and she was one of the 17 selected to interview. The Stamps scholarship honors "academics, leadership, service, innovation, perseverance". She attended a Honor Scholars dinner on January 10th and 11th where she received a top honor from the President of the University, Michael Gottfredson (sitting next to him at the Honor's dinner), with a University Certificate of Achievement awarded.

During the event Raichle was awarded the Summit and the Presidential Scholarships (approximately \$56,000 in tuition and living expenses) and acceptance to the Robert D Clark Honors College for year 2014. They will announce the five Stamps scholarship recipients in the spring. The Stamps Scholarship provides a full ride to the college including room, board, tuition, books, etc. The dinner program provided entertainment from the U of O nationally recognized singing group, On the Rocks, in a very small venue. Raichle was honored to be recognized by the University as a semi-finalist and appreciates the education she has received from Wilson High School.
