WILSON SPEAKERS TAKE TOP HONORS AT UO TOURNAMENT

Over 40 schools, over 600 participants, and one winner in Division 2 ... **Wilson Speech and Debate** took **first place** in the small team division at this weekend's Robert D. Clark Invitational Tournament at the University of Oregon. For the fifth time in six tournaments, every member of the Wilson team made elimination rounds in at least one event, an unprecedented run of team success. Congratulations to Individual Event finalists **Ashlynne Olsen** (After Dinner Speaking) and **Edward Szczepanski** (Radio Commentary). Edward also took the 10th place spot in individual speaker awards in Public Forum Debate. **Benedicte Hamilton** won 3rd place in junior Oratory, and **Michael Streinz** took 2nd in junior Extemporaneous. **Chris Meabe** won first place in Radio Commentary, and broke to Quarterfinals in a crowded field that started elimination rounds at the Octofinal level with his partner **Eli Morgan-Steiner**. Next Saturday at Oregon City High School is the final invitational tournament of the season. Later in March students will compete for spots at the National Speech and Debate Association championships, and in April the OSAA District and State tournaments will take place.
