NEW HEALTH COURSE ... HELP US STOCK THE KITCHEN WITH EQUIPMENT

One pot, one pan, one mixing bowl, one apron ... if everyone gave just one item, we would have a fully stocked kitchen. Wilson is excited to offer a new Health elective course this spring called Nutrition and Wellness and taught by Wilson Health teacher Josh Martin. Goal of this course is to offer students an opportunity to experience issues, information, and skills regarding the foods they eat. In addition to studying nutrition and how food choices affect our health, we will tackle topics such as food safety and food-born illnesses resulting in students earning their Oregon Food Handler's Safety certification. We will study the merits and drawbacks of different specialized diets. Students will learn about where their food comes from and the importance of fresh, whole food choices over other less healthy options. Class will also learn some basic safety and cooking skills in the kitchen, along with budgeting and menu planning. There will be hands-on demonstrations and presentations by local professionals in the food and food service industries. To do all of these things, we need to stock our kitchen labs with new/gently used kitchen equipment: pots and pans (non-stick preferred), cooking utensils (all types), dish towels, aprons, wash cloths, sponges, mixing bowls, measuring cups and spoons, dish drying racks, etc. If you, or someone you know, would like to donate materials for this class, please contact Josh Martin (imartin2@pps.net) or Kate Morgan (kmorgan@pps.net) ASAP. When submitting photos, let us know which photo or photos you would like to be featured most prominently. In general, an 1/8 page ad can have 1 or 2 photos with about 40 words; a 1/4 page ad can have up to 4 photos; a 1/2 page ad can have up to 8 photos; and full page ads can have up to 16 photos. For all but the 1/8 page ad, the amount of words that can be included is flexible at the expense of photo space. For 1/2 and full page ads, multi-family ads are an option.
