WILSON OFFERS NEW ONLINE SPORTS REGISTRATION

Wilson's Athletic Director, Mike Easton, is excited to announce that Wilson is now offering the convenience of online sports registration through an organization called FamilyID. Over 400 high schools currently use FamilyID and FamilyID boasts a 98% renewal rate of their schools. This online registration offers three excellent benefits—

1. It's a secure registration platform that provides parents with an easy, user-friendly way to register for our program. When you register through FamilyID, the system keeps track of your information in your FamilyID profile so you enter your information only once for multiple uses, multiple family members and multiple programs. You only need to update your information when necessary. Also, FamilyID has no ads on their site, and will never sell or share your contact information.

2. It will enable the athletic office and bookkeeper to be much more administratively efficient and environmentally responsible.

3. Coaches will receive essential updated info such as email addresses, safety information and clearance data so they can communicate effectively with parents.

Tryouts/practice for winter sports starts Nov 17, so parents of winter athletes should register now with Family ID to get cleared to participate. This is now an **online-only** process.

NEWS FROM THE COLLEGE CENTER: FINANCIAL AID 101

College is an expensive investment and you want to maximize your opportunity to receive financial aid. To qualify for financial, you file a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) based on earnings and assets in the base year (2014 for this year's seniors). While there are no "tricks" to improve your situation, if you understand the system, you can avoid some mistakes. Not all sources of money are assessed equally in the FAFSA calculations. Student assets, typically savings and earnings, are considered most available and consequently are tapped at about 20%. Parent assets are somewhat protected since they have other demands on their resources. Their savings and cash accounts will be targeted closer to 5%-12%. Often well-meaning relatives gift students money to help pay for college, and it is kept in a special account in the student's name. It is wise to have these \$ in the parent's name prior to the end of the base year. If you have put money in a 529 College Savings Account, these funds are treated as a parent asset, so have some protection. In the financial aid game, "knowledge is power"; be sure you attend the Financial Aid Workshop at Wilson on December, 2nd. This is a must for seniors and their parents, but is open to all grade levels. We encourage families with students in grades 9-12 to attend.

DONATE TOOLS FOR BIKE SHOP

The Special Education program at Wilson is starting a new enterprise for students who want to build their mechanical skills: *The Green Team Bike Shop*. This is a student-run enterprise that builds and repairs bicycles, incorporates financial and business education, and provides hands-on experience. This unique program incorporates STEM education, vocational skills, community safety and cycling into a single experience involving kids with disabilities and kids without disabilities. Service learning projects will also be incorporated as we partner with bicycle-oriented charities such as Bikes to Africa. In order to make this project work, we need donations of bicycle specific tools. Any bike or mechanics tools will be appreciated as well as bike shop fixtures, parts, supplies, and used bicycles. NEW HEALTH COURSE ... HELP US STOCK THE KITCHEN WITH EQUIPMENT

One pot, one pan, one mixing bowl, one apron ... if everyone gave just one item, we would have a fully stocked kitchen. Wilson is excited to offer a new Health elective course this spring called **Nutrition and Wellness** and taught by Wilson Health teacher **Josh Martin**. Goal of this course is to offer students an opportunity to experience issues, information, and skills regarding the foods they eat. In addition to studying nutrition and how food choices affect our health, we will tackle topics such as food safety and food-born illnesses resulting in students earning their Oregon Food Handler's Safety certification. We will study the merits and drawbacks of different specialized diets. Students will learn about where their food comes from and the importance of fresh, whole food choices over other less healthy options. Class will also learn some basic safety and cooking skills in the kitchen, along with budgeting and menu planning. There will be hands-on demonstrations and presentations by local professionals in the food and food service industries. This year, in order to create a more consistent look in the year- book, the business staff will be putting together the ads in house. Photos and the message you would like included can either be submitted via email to khigbee@pps.net (make sure to put Senior Parent Ad in the subject line) or placed in Keith Higbee's box in the main office (be sure to include instructions on how you would like your photos returned).
