NEWS FROM THE COLLEGE CENTER: FINANCIAL AID 101

College is an expensive investment and you want to maximize your opportunity to receive financial aid. To qualify for financial, you file a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) based on earnings and assets in the base year (2014 for this year's seniors). While there are no "tricks" to improve your situation, if you understand the system, you can avoid some mistakes. Not all sources of money are assessed equally in the FAFSA calculations. Student assets, typically savings and earnings, are considered most available and consequently are tapped at about 20%. Parent assets are somewhat protected since they have other demands on their resources. Their savings and cash accounts will be targeted closer to 5%-12%. Often well-meaning relatives gift students money to help pay for college, and it is kept in a special account in the student's name. It is wise to have these \$ in the parent's name prior to the end of the base year. If you have put money in a 529 College Savings Account, these funds are treated as a parent asset, so have some protection. In the financial aid game, "knowledge is power"; be sure you attend the Financial Aid Workshop at Wilson on December, 2nd. This is a must for seniors and their parents, but is open to all grade levels. We encourage families with students in grades 9-12 to attend.

This year, in order to create a more consistent look in the year-book, business staff will put together the ads in house. Photos and message you would like included can either be submitted via email to khigbee@pps.net (make sure to put Senior Parent Ad in subject line) or placed in Keith Higbee's box in main office (be sure to include instructions on how you would like your photos returned). When submitting photos, let us know which photo or photos you would like to be featured most prominently. In general, an 1/8 page ad can have 1 or 2 photos with about 40 words; a 1/4 page ad can have up to 4 photos; a 1/2 page ad can have up to 8 photos; and full page ads can have up to 16 photos.
