MIKE CLOPTON RETIRES AS WILSON BASEBALL COACH

Mike Clopton has retired as Wilson High baseball coach after more than a half-century in coaching. According to an article in the Portland Tribune, Clopton had a four-decade run at Wilson and Jackson highs, where his teams won state championships in 2006 and 2012. He has spent 51 years in coaching baseball in Portland. Among his many honors over the years was a national high school coach of the year award. Clopton's successor with the Trojans will be **Jeremy Shetler**, one of his longtime assistant coaches. Jeremy is Dean of Students and teacher at Wilson. "Coach Clopton created a culture where alumni players realized what a great experience they had and have given back with their time and money," says Shetler. "Over 50 former players have coached in the Wilson baseball program at some level, either school ball or summer ball." Well done, Coach Clopton! Congratulations, Jeremy!
