PAX (Program of Academic Exchange) is one of the exchange programs Wilson has had the pleasure of having their students with us over the years. Becoming a Host Family for PAX. Program of Academic Exchange offers your family the chance to share your daily life with an international exchange student for a semester or school year. Hosting is a terrific way to learn more about another country and culture. Everyday activities will take on new meaning when you share them with a student who is eager to discover the American way of life. At the same time, your family will learn and grow as you exchange ideas and compare lifestyles. It's like taking a trip without having to leave home. PAX is a fully accredited exchange visitor program. It is smaller than many programs offering you personal and consistent support throughout the time you are a host family. The responsibilities of a host family are that you be ready to share your life with a PAX student as if they were a son or daughter. This means providing the student with a bed and quiet place to study, three quality meals a day, transportation to and from school activities and the love and support a teenager needs while adapting to life in the U.S. Students come with monthly expense money, health insurance and an eagerness to help out with light chores around the house. Students are motivated to succeed and grow in their adventure, often stating that they want to return to their families with a new maturity and autonomy after living in the U.S. PAX Community Coordinators are available 24 hours a day 7 days a week to answer questions, to intervene or to assist in a smooth experience for your family and students. While this is a volunteer act on the part of your family, there is a tax deduction monthly of up to \$50/school month that the student is with you. I sincerely trust that being a host family will enlarge your world and be an opportunity to cultivate peace in our world at large.
