New: Parking Citations Will Be Issued Beginning Thursday, August 30

Cars parked in the Wilson or Rieke parking lots that do not display a valid parking permit will be ticketed beginning Thursday, August 30. Students with a valid drivers license and insurance may apply to purchase a parking permit, but note that parking is first-come, first-served and that having a permit does not guarantee a parking space will be available when you arrive. New: 2018-19 Requests from Wilson's Social Worker

- Chewy granola bars, fruit snacks, trail mix packs, juice boxes: Help provide snacks between classes and during tutor times for re-fueling and energy.
- Canned foods (peanut butter, chili, beans, soup, jams, jellies and non-perishables): Last year, thanks to parents' donations and Neighborhood House, 30 bags of food were given out to Wilson students and their families and 1,903 sandwiches were provided to Wilson students.
- New/used ukuleles or gift cards to purchase: This year we hope to obtain 10 ukuleles for Music Mondays and Wellness Wednesdays, lunch-time meetings that give students opportunities to share and to practice positive coping skills to reduce the stressors and anxieties in their daily lives.
- Fred Meyer and Target gift cards: Throughout the year, Wilson students and families experience crises, which may include job loss, long-term illnesses, deaths in the families, etc. If you can help, consider donating Fred Meyer and Target Gift Cards. Last year, 21 Wilson students and families were provided gift cards totaling \$4300.00.

New: A Message from PPS Nutrition Services

Starting this school year, the kitchen will be offering each student the opportunity to purchase one breakfast and one lunch per day. Students will not be able to purchase additional meals or milk. This new process supports the District's wellness policy, as well as Portland's sustainability efforts. The policy will also help reduce confusion around use of school meal funds on the student's account. For example, charging additional meals and/or milk without parent knowledge and approval.

Water is freely available in the cafeteria during lunch and milk will still be offered as a part of a complete meal. As always, unlimited fruits and veggies are available to students purchasing school lunch.

Student Parking

2018-19 student parking permits were available for purchase beginning May 30, 2018. All students who have a driver's license and proof of insurance may purchase a permit. Note that a parking permit does not guarantee a parking space: it allows a student to park in the lot when a legal space is available. Permits are required to park at Wilson or in the Rieke parking lot. Student parking spaces will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. To apply for a parking permit, students may bring a completed parking permit application, proof of license and insurance, and \$25 to the bookkeeper's office during a time when they are not in class. Parking at Wilson is limited so please consider carpooling, public transportation or other
