#### 2017 PSAT Scores Coming This Week

Wilson 10th- and 11th-grade students who took the PSAT should look for an email the week of December 11 with a link to access their PSAT scores if they entered an email address during test registration in October. Students who did not provide an email address can get a paper copy when Wilson receives them in January.

Be sure to access your scores online so that you can take advantage of the free personalized SAT test preparation you can receive by linking your score report to the Khan academy website. To do this you can follow the directions in the email you receive, wait to get the access code on the paper copy we receive, or come to the College & Career Center (Rm 149) at lunch on Wednesday, December 1 and 3, or Thursday, December 14, to get your access code.

Sophomores should plan a course of study for the junior-year PSAT based on their sophomore-year scores. Qualification for the National Merit Scholarship Program is based on junior-year scores.

#### **Pre-Ninth Grade Credits**

All pre-ninth grade credits will remain on the student transcript unless they are requested to be removed by the end of the first semester of **freshman year**.

Why would students want a credit removed? Students sometimes want B's or C's removed because these grades appear to be lowering the grade point average early on. Some students want to strive for a straight-A average, and grades lower than an A from middle school would prevent that.

Important: Removing a credit doesn't change your placement in the next level but can impact your progression through graduation requirements. Removing a middle school Algebra credit, for example, would mean that the three math classes that count toward graduation would start with Geometry in 9th grade. Please submit the request form to your counselor by mid-January if you wish to have a credit removed.
