On February 11, three Wilson Robotics Teams competed against other teams from all over the state at FIRST Tech Challenge Tournaments. Team 7776 Loose Screws finished as the Finalist Alliance Captain and received the 2nd-place Inspire Award (best showing in all categories) and Think Award (best engineering notebook). Teams 9231 Big Bots and 10565 System Online advanced on their overall team rankings based on robot performance. The season started with over 200 teams across Oregon; the final 48 remaining teams will compete at the state championship on February 24 and 25 at Liberty High School, Hillsboro, for a spot at the Western Regional Competition in Spokane.
