Peer Counseling is a class in which students master active listening skills and contribute a lot of behind-the-scenes support for our student community.

Here's what they've been up to this year:

- Peers volunteered 56 hours during registration welcoming new kids to Wilson
- They have given at least 38 welcoming tours to students who transfer to WHS mid-year, and follow up to help them get connected here
- They served 291 plates of pancakes in October, to help our student body get to know them
- They have given at least 15 tours to interested 8th-grade families who are considering WHS next year--and they do SUCH a great job of representing our school
- Peers delivered 30-40 minute presentations to 16 sections of freshman classes in October and again in February covering topics including: all the resources for help at WHS, the importance of getting involved at school, goal-setting, positive behavior, creating a kind community, managing stress, and self care.
- Currently, they are working one-on-one providing support to over 30 freshman students who've asked to meet with a peer

Soon, they will be carrying out projects that help our community. In recent years these have included the College Panel for all Juniors, presentations to incoming 8th-grade classes, volunteering at community events, reaching out to our ELD and Pioneer students, and other student-driven efforts. Wilson Peer Counselors are a (small but) mighty group!
