## **Wilson Robotics Results**

The four Wilson Robotics teams competed Saturday, January 26, in the FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) Qualifying Tournament.

Team 7776 (Loose Screws) finished fifth and advanced to the Oregon Super Qualifying Tournament in February. They also received the Think Award for the best Engineering Notebook and were awarded third place for the Motivate Award, third place for the Connect Award (both awarded for outreach and connection with the greater community), and third place for the Inspire Award (the highest ranking award) for overall excellence. Additionally, **Rispa Vranka Wafula** and **Rachel Weirnick** were selected as semi-finalists for the FIRST Dean's List Award.
