5. Students meet with their counselor (before and after school, during a free period, lunch or study hall) to finish forecasting.

www.theWashboard.org is a great resource for scholarships. Students create profiles and are instantly matched with the scholarships for which they are eligible to apply. Here are a few that Wilson students could qualify for:

C. E. Boucher Memorial Scholarship. Financially assistance for engineering students attending school in Washington or Oregon at the University of Washington, Washington State University, University of Oregon or Oregon State University, Award: \$3,000 (4)

Atsuhiko Tateuchi Memorial Scholarship. \$5000 scholarships for students from the Pacific Rim states (Alaska, California, Hawaii, Oregon and Washington) who demonstrate hard work, dedication and sincerity. Students must have financial need, academic merit and be of Japanese or other Asian ancestry, including multi-ethnic Asians. Students from middle income families are encouraged to apply. This scholarship will be renewable for up to four years, \$5,000 (10)

Blacks at Microsoft (BAM!) Scholarship. Established to encourage and enable black high school students to go to college, realize the impact technology has on the world and target a career in the technology industry. There is potential for a renewal of \$5000 for up to four years for a total of \$20,000.

Patricia Fisher Endowed Scholarship. Established by the Seattle Association of Black Journalists to support students of color who pursue college careers in journalism. This one-time scholarship ranges from \$500-\$2500, with recipients able to reapply.

Alden Landis Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship is intended for current high school students (grades 10-12) who demonstrate financial need and who successfully apply for enrollment in a summer study abroad, service trip, or a gap

year program run by a 501(c)(3) public charity. Students must demonstrate a commitment to community service and learning about other cultures.

Microsoft DisAbility Scholarship. This scholarship enables high school students with disabilities to go to college and target a career in the technology industry.

Pre-Ninth Grade Credits

All pre-ninth grade credits will remain on the student transcript unless they are requested to be removed by the end of the first semester of **freshman year**.

Why would students want a credit removed? Students sometimes want B's or C's removed because these grades appear to be lowering the grade point average early on. Some students want to strive for a straight-A average, and grades lower than an A from middle school would prevent that.

Important: Removing a credit doesn't change your placement in the next level but can impact your progression through graduation requirements. Removing a middle school Algebra credit, for example, would mean that the three math classes that count toward graduation would start with Geometry in 9th grade.
