Fred G. Lee Memorial Scholarship Application

Three scholarships will be awarded. One (1) \$4,000 Scholarship; the award is \$1000 per year, renewable for four undergraduate years. Two (2) \$1000 Scholarships; the award is \$1000, issued at the freshman year level. At least one of the three scholarships will be awarded to a student who attends a college in Oregon or Washington State. The eligible scholarship territory is Clark County (State of Washington) and Oregon high school graduating seniors. Chinese Ancestry is not a requirement for this scholarship and all applicants must have at least one parent/guardian who is a member of the C.A.C.A. Portland Lodge. The deadline date for the application is April 11, 2018.

David Lee Quan Memorial Scholarship

A \$1000.00 scholarship will be awarded to a deserving applicant majoring in the medical or science profession. The deadline date for this application is April 11, 2018.

C.A.C.A. Essay Contest

All high school students of are invited to participate in the upcoming essay contest. Applicants are expected to write a 500-word English theme within two hours, on a topic given at the beginning of the contest. Judging is conducted by a national board of judges organized by the Grand Lodge of the C.A.C.A. Top essays are evaluated for originality, clarity of thought and expression, and correctness of grammar and spelling. Chinese ancestry is not a requirement for this essay contest.

The contest will be held Saturday March 3, 2018 commencing promptly at 10:00 am. The contest will end at noon. Pre-registration is required, and the contest is open to all high school students in Oregon and SW Washington. Local prizes will be awarded, in addition to the National judging. The deadline date for the essay contest application is February 27, 2018.

Tiffany Wang Arts Scholarship

Two students will be selected to each receive \$500 towards a summer arts program. These arts scholarships are offered for (1) pre-college student (grades 9-11) who are interested in attending a summer arts program, (2) demonstrated financial need, and (3) talent in the fine or performing arts. Applications are due by April 11, 2018.

Pre-Ninth Grade Credits

All pre-ninth grade credits will remain on the student transcript unless they are requested to be removed by the end of the first semester of **freshman year**.

Why would students want a credit removed? Students sometimes want B's or C's removed because these grades appear to be lowering the grade point average early on. Some students want to strive for a straight-A average, and grades lower than an A from middle school would prevent that.

Important: Removing a credit doesn't change your placement in the next level but can impact your progression through graduation requirements. Removing a middle school Algebra credit, for example, would mean that the three math classes that count toward graduation would start with Geometry in 9th grade. Please submit the request form to your counselor by mid-January if you wish to have a credit removed. You can find the form here: www.pps.net/cms/lib/
