## Student Parking for the 2018/19 School Year

2018-19 student parking permits will be available for purchase beginning May 30, 2018. All students who have a driver's license and proof of insurance may purchase a permit. Note that a parking permit does not guarantee a parking space: it allows a student to park in the lot when a legal space is available. Permits are required to park at Wilson or in the Rieke parking lot. Student parking spaces will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. To apply for a parking permit, students may bring a completed parking permit application, proof of license and insurance, and \$25 to the bookkeeper's office during a time when they are not in class. Parking at Wilson is limited so please consider carpooling, public transportation or other modes of transportation.
