Boys and girls Tennis Districts were last week. Congrats to **Caden Samkutty** who finished 3rd in singles and will be going to State next week. **John Elliot** and **Erik Maack** were consolation winners in Doubles.

In Track the highly competitive PIL District Meet for boys and girls will be held this Wednesday and Friday at Marshall Campus. The Wilson Boys will be defending their PIL title, led by **Caleb Seely** who has the best time in State this year in the 1500, and **Alex Slenning** who has the 2nd best time in the 3000.

For Softball and Baseball it's the last week of league games. Wilson Softball is in the hunt for a playoff spot, led by **Saioa Lostra** who is 3rd in the State with a .636 batting average, and is in the Top 15 in home runs and runs scored.

In Baseball, Wilson is ranked #18 with an important series vs. Lincoln this week. The first game is at home Tuesday at 4:30. The following Trojans are in the Top 15 in State in these categories: **Sammy DeVol** and **Carson Krake** in RBI's, **Garrett Leeper** in runs scored, and pitchers **Cade Conklin** in wins and **Ben Haxby** in strikeouts. Ben is #3 in State in earned run average.

Boys and Girls Golf each finished 2nd in the PIL, and Regionals are today at Stone Creek Golf Course. **Jessica Ewton** and **Mariquia Alferez** however have already qualified for State for the girls, and **Atlas Asaro** and **Loren Sckerl** for the boys. Good luck to them at State next week!

The Wilson Girls Lacrosse team is currently 8-3 and ranked 19th in state, putting them in a position to be playoff contenders. The team boasts an impressive 12 goal scorers with captains **Rylee Sutherland** and **Anne Kirschbaum** leading the charge with 40 and 38 goals respectively.

The Boys Lacrosse team is currently ranked 18th in state, and they are lined up for a solid playoff spot. Both the Varsity and JV programs have been competitive this season, and look to finish strong pushing into the post season. The boys teams last league game is on Monday 5/15 at 8:00 pm vs Hood River at the Wilson Stadium.
