The replacement of Rieke Field under the Parks Replacement Bond will include the removal and replacement of the existing outdated synthetic turf field with new

synthetic turf specific for soccer and lacrosse. The replacement field will be the same size and in the same place as the existing field. This project will also provide new sports field furnishings, drinking fountain, a dedicated location for temporary restroom facilities, and provisions for future sports field lighting. Meeting the essential skills is a graduation requirement; if you are missing one or more you will not graduate. Meeting essential skills is not the same as passing your classes.
