On February 20, all Juniors will take the ACT at Wilson for free. With a little preparation, this could be your one and only college entrance exam. Wilson's College and Career Center is here to help with a full-length practice ACT exam. October 29 is a teacher planning day, so there is no school for students. Tests are scored on the spot so you will have instant feedback to help you prepare for the real test in February. Taking the practice test can help you do your best on testing day. Test scores are needed to apply to most colleges and can also be used to determine merit-based financial aid. Arrive by 9:30am so we can get everyone in and seated to start by 10:00am.
