Financial Aid Night, Wilson Cafeteria, 6:30pm

Jennifer Satalino of The College Place Oregon will be our guest speaker and financial aid guru. She will walk through all of the ways to pay for college including Oregon-specific grants, loans, scholarship searching, and most importantly an in-depth look at the gateway to financial aid form—the FAFSA.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opens up on October 1 this year. The FAFSA form is used by colleges to process your financial aid package, including grant money. Some scholarships also require you to have filed a FAFSA form, so all students should file the FAFSA even if you do not think you qualify for financial aid.

If you need letters of recommendation for college applications, you must attend one of the Letter of Recommendation workshops offered by the College & Career Center. The workshop will be offered three times this fall, be sure to attend one of them. You will get an explanation, receive the packet to fill out for your counselor, and have the opportunity to ask questions. Letter of Rec requests must be made at least three weeks before your first application due date. The final workshop date for this fall is October 16.
