Student Parking at Wilson

Operating a vehicle is a significant responsibility, and driving to school is a privilege. Violations to any parking and driving rule may result in a loss of parking privilege and/or school discipline. For the safety of all of our students and staff the following driving rules are in effect:

Parking Permits: The permit covers all 108 WHS student parking spots + 30 Rieke elementary parking spots. These spots are painted with white numbers. Student spots are for permitted vehicles on a first-come, first-served basis. We have six permits left for sale. After these six are sold, we will be done selling permits for the year.

Staff Parking: Staff parking spots (orange numbered spots) are assigned and staff are required to show their parking permit at all times while parking in their assigned spot.

Parking regulations are strictly enforced. It is a privilege to park on school grounds. Loss of permit, towing of vehicle and/or school discipline may be imposed when these rules and regulations are violated. Students are to display their permit when parking in student parking.

Parking Tickets: Campus Security will issue warning tickets for violations to the above rules. Drivers who receive repeated parking tickets/warnings for violations to school parking and driving rules will be subject to school discipline, loss of parking privilege and towing of vehicle at owner's expense.
