Bit Project is offering a **free 8 week program** for high school students to explore the intersection of programming, marketing, and project management. We realized that summer opportunities were being stripped away not only from college undergraduates, but also high school students due to COVID-19. Thus, we wanted to design a program called <u>Bit Heroes</u> that would allow high school students to gain hand-ons experience as Developers, where they can use their technical knowledge to make cutting edge developer tools accessible to the masses. Here is an overview of the program:

- The duration of this program will run from June 29th to August 24th, remotely.
- Meeting and networking with Microsoft developers—who will be the mentors during the program—,undergraduate college students across the nation, and other industry professionals.
- Students will be split into teams with each team consisting of 7 members and 1 project manager to put together a technical marketing campaign to gain professional work experience that'll give students a head start later in their collegiate-level internship searches.

• Each team will then have different Integrated Marketing Campaigns (IMC) that they can choose to work on.

The main goal of the program is to produce a live webinar hosted by the students to demonstrate the product to their target audience. Along the way, they would create technical blog posts and produce a podcast that makes technical concepts more friendly to their desired audience.
