Dear Wilson Families,

On Wednesday night the Oregon Department of Education updated its *Distance Learning for All* guidance with a new section: *Supporting our Students in Grades 9, 10, and 11.* The <u>updated guidance</u> includes information about credits and essential learning for the Class of 2021, Class of 2022, and Class of 2023.

This guidance calls on educators across the state to focus instruction and work with our high school students on **care**, **connection and essential learning**. Students will receive credit for the spring semester classes based on the work completed through March 13 and mastery of essential learning this spring. This essential learning will be centered on key standards students need to be ready for next school year. Per state

guidance, teachers will assign grades Pass/Incomplete instead of traditional letter grades.

The work we are engaged in, like all academic learning, requires teacher-student connection. We will continue to make every effort to reach every student and to provide them access to continual learning opportunities; this includes making sure students have computers and internet access at home. We will also finalize and communicate ways to support students who have earned Incomplete marks.

Please continue to reach out to us to let us know how we can support you and your family. In the meantime, you can find information and resources available to students and families on the <u>district's website</u>.

The 2020-21 school year in Portland Public Schools will start on Wednesday, Sept. 2, and end on Friday, June 11 (if weather allows). The calendar for next school year was approved by the Board of Education. (See the full, downloadable calendar).

WHS 2020-2021 Fall Registration Dates

At Registration, students have their yearbook picture taken, pay school fees, receive their school id card, and course schedule. Be sure to come ready to have your yearbook photo taken and send cash, check, or credit card with students attending without a parent.

If you are unable to attend your scheduled registration time and date, there is a make-up registration session for grades 10-12. If you can't attend either of those registration dates, all registration items may be taken care of on the first day of school from 7:30am-3:00pm. All new students will have appointments with counselors during Senior, Junior, Sophomores and Freshmen registration.

Spring Athletic Fees

Dear Wilson Families,

As you know, Gov. Kate Brown has canceled all in-person classes in the state for the rest of the 2019-20 school year due COVID 19. Following that announcement, the Oregon School Activities Association, which governs high school sports in the state, has canceled all spring sports and championships.

Here in Portland Public Schools, those decisions mean that spring sports are canceled for the Portland Interscholastic League at the high school levels. We know this is difficult news for student-athletes who have been hard at work preparing for the spring season, especially for the seniors. Please know that you are not alone, that your disappointment is one of the sacrifices that all of us are making during this historic crisis. For spring athletes, your coaches will stay in touch with you throughout the season. Our coaches will continue to follow the guidelines set by the OSAA which are updated at the <u>organization's coronavirus webpage</u>.

Wilson families who have paid the **PIL Spring Sports Fee** have the following options:

1. Request a refund-The funds will be returned to you using the same method of payment you used originally. Please note, electronic refunds (if you paid with a credit or debit card) will be issued first. It will take additional time process refunds for families that paid with a check or cash. We will issue and mail a check back to these families. We are still navigating how to physically get refund checks processed, signed and mailed during this time.

2. Donate the fee to help defray the cost of equipment that we have already procured for spring and help to pay the stipends for our coaches.

If you would like to donate your fee, please reach out to Ana Curtis at acurtis@pps.net by April 23rd. If you paid by credit card, you should receive your refund soon. If you paid by check or cash, we will have to print a check and mail it which could take 1-2 weeks.

We hope that all of you are safe and sound during these unprecedented times.

Coronavirus and College - What you Need to Know!

Greetings Wilson families,

I hope that this message finds you well and managing through this difficult time. I have been reading and sifting through the ever changing landscape of health and education announcements that have been issued. While it is difficult to pull together the right information and resources and then figure out how to share them, the folks at <u>Oregon Goes to College</u> have done a fabulous job putting together a VERY COMPREHENSIVE set of information on how and what to do if you are a junior, a senior, or a current college student as well as a general update section on changes in the admissions world with <u>videos, clickable checklists</u>, and resources!

Please use this fantastic resource as it is all that you need to know about college and testing in Oregon. UPDATES are posted as things continue to change - including a chat function, and advice from local admissions counselors <u>oregongoestocollege.org/corona</u>

There are a few updates I would like to point out to you as well:

- 1. <u>Please reach out</u> with questions on college related things to myself kmilford@pps.net or to your counselor while we are out of the building we can help! We are working on video and calling options as well and will communicate these when available.
- Oregon Promise: There is a tentative Expected Family Contribution (EFC) limit of 34,000 for Class of 2020 applicants. Visit Oregon Promise FAQs for all details.



- 3. <u>Seniors</u> most Oregon schools and many others have moved their commitment/deposit day from May 1 to June 1 see the list on the website along with links to all of our schools online virtual tours!
- 4. <u>ALL Oregon Public Universities have announced they will be TEST OPTIONAL (meaning</u> admissions test ACT/SAT) moving forward class of 2021 onward!
- 5. <u>The PTA Scholarship deadline has been extended until the End Of APRIL on 30th</u> I am waiting for an update on how to turn it in. If you have submitted it to me or would like to do so via email, I will make sure to get your app. to the right place. Look for an update on this.
- 6. Many colleges across the nation are committed to helping the class of 2021 by going test optional for next year and understanding that grades and transcripts across the nation will look different. They will evaluate students based on the greater context of COVID 19 as well as our local context.

Merla and Pat Lotz Scholarship for WHS Music Senior - \$2000 Award

Merle and Pat Lotz were active music teachers and in Portland from 1951-1995. Merle spent 32 years in public school choral teaching (at Jefferson, Wilson, and Benson High Schools); as well as serving as church music director, performing as pianist with the Oregon Symphony Pops orchestra, and running his own dance band for 45 years. Pat was a public school music teacher, accompanist for the Portland Chorale, and a private piano teacher for 45 years. She and Merle took the Wilson high school choir on a trip to Europe in 1971, creating the memories of a lifetime for 70 young singers.

This music scholarship is a powerful way to honor and celebrate their many years of dedication to music education, as well as their love of students and people, and their understanding of the positive impact of music in the hearts and lives of all people.

Applicants must have taken music classes at Wilson. In addition to this application, you must have two teachers write a letter of recommendation. One teacher must be from Wilson and the other can be a private music teacher or your WHS Music teacher.

This form includes three questions. Please choose one question to answer in paragraph form. The Lotz Family would also like a 3-5 minute recording of your work. Four Years Free @ PSU New GPA requirement - 3.2

Portland State University proudly covers standard tuition and mandatory fees for qualified incoming freshman students. All applicants are automatically considered for Four Years Free, no separate application is required.

Four Years Free is an institutional aid program that covers standard tuition and mandatory fees for eligible Oregon high school graduates who enroll full-time. The program covers remaining standard tuition and mandatory fees after financial aid is applied. Initial awards are calculated at 15 credit hours per term and the amount is finalized at the end of the second week of the term when registration closes. Differential tuition and fees are assessed separately for certain academic programs and students are responsible for covering those additional charges.

Four Years Free money does not cover room and board, books and supplies, transportation or personal expenses.



Eligibility

Students must meet all of the requirements below:

- · Oregon resident
- · Oregon high school graduate
- · 3.20 cumulative unweighted high school GPA
- · Pell Grant-eligible according to FAFSA
- · First-time PSU student
- Enroll full time (12 to 15 credits per term)
- Start in fall term

The district released <u>Graduation Pathways 2020</u>, the guidance for high school seniors, including graduation requirements and information regarding the grading of coursework. On Friday (4/10/20), the district put out this <u>FAQ</u>.

Senior college news -

- Mid year reports if your counselor wrote a letter for you, they will go in and send your mid-year reports as soon as we get transcripts in Synergy - likely Monday Feb. 3rd. Do not worry if your deadline has passed!
- If you are applying to UofO and/or OSU with the Common Application, it requires your counselor fills out a form that gets sent with your transcript, so please check in with them so they know to send it.
- If you added any schools to your Common Application after your counselor/teachers submitted letters of rec for you, you must let them know so they can resubmit

- <u>OSAC</u> 1 app for Oregonians to apply to up to 40 scholarships! DUE March 1st oregonstudentaid.gov

They are all scheduled to visit Wilson High School this fall, along with 47 other colleges and universities so far. Log in to your Naviance account to check the current list of colleges and get signed up.

Why are college visits important?

- A good way to begin thinking about what you want out of a college experience is by attending a visit and listening to presentations. They can help you figure out what you don't know about what might be important to you!
- Juniors and seniors can help narrow down or expand their interests in colleges
- The college reps that make the visits are often the reader of your application when you apply, so if you intend to apply to a school that is visiting us, it is worth your while to meet them face to face and show interest in their school

Keep in mind that most college visits happen during class time and you are responsible for what you miss, so choose responsibly and wisely
