Dear Wilson Families,

Next week we will begin bagging students' personal items from lockers, including gym lockers. Also, we are in the process of finalizing our plans for the June 8 graduation for our Class of 2020. I am pleased to let you know that all of our graduates will have a chance to walk across the stage, get their diploma, and have their picture taken.

The drive-in graduation event will take place at Wilson High School from 10am-5pml. We can only allow one car per graduate and we ask our students to arrive during their designated time. <u>Please read about all the details here.</u> If we assume that each graduate will need about a minute to get out of the car, walk onto the stage, have their picture taken, and walk back into their car, our graduation day will take six and a half hours. I know that I will enjoy every minute of that day but I do want to make sure that our event runs smoothly and that our graduates don't spend most of the day in cars, waiting for their turn. WHS Staff Appreciation

The 2019/2020 school year was full of changes. However, one thing that remained the same was WHS staff's commitment to students. Students were asked to comment on how WHS staff made an impact this school year. <u>Here</u> are a few of the comments.

WHS Student Locker Items Pick up

Here is the schedule of when students can pick up their items from the staff parking lot:

- Seniors Wednesday, 6/3, 10-12
- Juniors Wednesday, 6/3, 1-3
- Sophomores Thursday, 6/4, 10-12
- Juniors Thursday, 6/4, 1-3

We are asking students/families to drive into the staff parking lot, on the Vermont Street side, during the designated time. Staff members will greet you in the parking lot and will deliver the appropriate bag. If you have textbooks, chrome books or calculators that need to be returned, bring them during your locker pickup time and we will collect them!

P-EBT Program (extra food benefits)

If your children normally get free or reduced price school meals, you're eligible to get extra grocery money. It's a new program called Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT).



For each month that school is closed and you are eligible, you will get \$5.70 per day for each of your children a K-12 school, school-based preschool, or school based Headstart that normally participate in the National School Lunch Program. AND you can still get "grab and go" meals from school during the pandemic!

Immigration status does not matter for Pandemic EBT. Pandemic EBT will <u>not</u> count in a public charge test. Here are the ways your family can receive the Pandemic EBT benefit:

- 1. Already get SNAP? The extra money will be loaded on your Oregon Trail EBT card automatically.
- Don't have SNAP, but already qualify for free or reduced school meals? A new EBT card will be automatically mailed to you with instructions. If your whole school gets free meals, you will qualify too. Even though Pandemic EBT uses the same type of card as SNAP, Pandemic EBT is NOT SNAP benefits and is <u>not</u> considered in a public charge test.
- 3. Never received SNAP or free and reduced price school meals before?
 - 1. A simple way to access the P-EBT benefit is by applying for free school meals here: <u>https://www.ode.state.or.us/apps/frlapp</u>.
 - 2. Receiving SNAP benefits can also qualify you, here's how to apply <u>https://govstatus.egov.com/or-dhs-benefits</u>.
 - 3. You will automatically be given Pandemic EBT benefits starting the month you're approved for either free school meals or SNAP.

PPS 2020-2021 School Calendar and WHS Fall Registration Dates

*Note: Some of the below information may change as we get close to registration (because of social distancing requirements).

The 2020-21 school year in Portland Public Schools will start on Wednesday, Sept. 2, and end on Friday, June 11 (if weather allows). The calendar for next school year was approved by the Board of Education. (See the full, downloadable calendar).

WHS 2020-2021 Fall Registration Dates

At Registration, students have their yearbook picture taken, pay school fees, receive their school id card, and course schedule. Be sure to come ready to have your yearbook photo taken and send cash, check, or credit card with students attending without a parent.

If you are unable to attend your scheduled registration time and date, there is a make-up registration session for grades 10-12. If you can't attend either of those registration dates, all registration items may be taken care of on the first day of school from 7:30am-3:00pm. All new students will have appointments with counselors during Senior, Junior, Sophomores and Freshmen registration.

Going Merry

Going Merry (<u>www.goingmerry.com</u>) is an awesome new scholarship website - it makes scholarship applications as easy as college applications are when you use the Common App!

Going Merry is completely different from the older scholarship search engines:

- Matching Once you fill out your profile, you are automatically matched with scholarships you are most eligible for.
- Direct Applications You can apply directly to multiple scholarships, you never need to leave the site.
- Autofilled Applications All of the information from your profile is autofilled into each application, saving you time.
- Estimated Application Times Every scholarship has estimated application time to help you prioritize them.
- Scholarships Grouped By Essay Topics Scholarships are grouped by common essay topics so you can minimize the number of essays you have to write.

238 Wilson High School students have sent 1,000 scholarships off so far this year!

Here are some broad-eligibility scholarships due in the next few months:

- 1. <u>Cyberbullying Awareness Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due May 31) essay contest on how to prevent cyberbullying
- 2. <u>Senior Homies Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due May 31) A scholarship that helps the young and the old: Student applicants must reach out to a senior citizen in their lives who might be struggling with social distancing, and then share a story from the senior's life.



- 3. <u>Scholarship4Moms</u> (\$10,000, due June 15) for mothers (including teen moms!) who are juggling motherhood and college
- 4. <u>GoGlobal Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due June 30) to support students who believe in importance of language learning
- 5. <u>MyBioSource Scholarship</u> (\$1000, June 30) to support students with disabilities
- 6. <u>ABC Humane Wildlife Academic Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due July 1) to support women studying STEM subjects
- 7. <u>David Struewing Memorial Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due July 1) to support students interested in improving emergency medical services, especially in the context of the opioid crisis
- 8. <u>Solar Scholarship</u> (\$1000, July 1) essay contest on "what excites you most about the future of solar power?"
- 9. <u>Thomas J Henry Leadership Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due July 1) This law firm awards \$1000 each academic semester to a student who demonstrates the importance of leadership. Applicants must write 750-1000 words on their leadership role experience, for a school sports team, club, outside organization, church, or volunteer group.
- 10. <u>Course Hero First-Generation Scholarship</u> (\$5000, due July 3) for students who are the first in their family to go to college.
- 11. <u>Course Hero Super Senior Scholarship</u> (\$5000, due July 3) Essay contest on some timely themes: What makes something true/fact? Do you think that people are susceptible to coercive persuasion? If so, what makes them susceptible?"
- 12. <u>Career Enjoyment Scholarship</u> (\$1000, due July 20) Essay on how the student plans to choose a career path that they love, adds value to the world, and that pays a good salary.

We also wanted to point out a few big scholarship opportunities with farther-out deadlines that your juniors should be aware of:

- <u>The Cameron Impact Scholarship</u> (Full ride scholarship, due Sep 15): This is a four-year, merit-based scholarship intended to cover the full tuition and 'qualified educational expenses' of 10-15 students who intend to use their degrees for social impact.
- <u>Horatio Alger Associate State Scholarship</u> (\$10,000, due Oct 25): For students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives, the Horatio Alger Association awards \$10,000 scholarships for students from each state. The student must be a US citizen and their family must earn \$55k or less.
- <u>Ron Brown Scholarship</u> (\$40,000, due Nov 1 early applicants, Jan 9 standard deadline): For talented and economically-challenged African American students who demonstrate a keen interest in public service, community engagement, business entrepreneurship and global citizenship.
- <u>American Chemical Society Scholarship</u> (\$5000 per academic year, due Mar 1): These are annually renewable scholarships (so could be worth \$20k) for underrepresented minority students majoring in undergraduate chemistry-related disciplines, and are also intending to pursue careers in chemistry-related fields
